THE TRANSDISCIPLINARY INTERNATIONAL LEARNING LABORATORY (TILL)

offers students from Canada, South Africa and Germany the opportunity to deepen their intercultural skills and provides an introduction to effectively apply transdisciplinary collaboration to tackle interconnected, wicked sustainability challenges. Under the mentorship of applied researchers and community partners, the international student teams will develop a systematic understanding of the issue at hand. Through a creative strategy design, student teams will address local issues that are aligned with the Sustainable Development Goals (SDGs) and the host Biosphere Reserve's research and development needs. This is an opportunity to network with students from other countries and cultural contexts and get an insight into life in the biosphere reserve. A region that is characterised by lakes, pine forests, ancient hat oaks and large unfragmented lowland beech forests. The TILL is designed to create a community of practice in which participants share a common passion and desire to learn from one another. We seek a practice built on respect and reciprocity that is based on curiosity, collaboration, connection, and accountability.

COSTS

Participants will receive a monthly stipend and travel costs. Both are funded by the German Academic Exchange Service (DAAD) and sponsored by the Federal Ministry of Education and Research and the Transdisciplinary Education Collaboration for Transformation in Sustainability (TRANSECTS) Initiative, funded by the Social Sciences and Research Council (SSHRC) of Canada. No tuition fees apply.
